DAMAGE STAMP TO HUNT BEAR
AND DEER

Harry Street, Game Warden, appeared before the Board and requested that the following ordinance be adopted, same having been duly published in The Lebanon News for two successive weeks as required by law indicating the Board of Supervisors intention to propose same for adoption at a public hearing to be conducted at 10:00 a.m., on August 4, 1975, said time having arrived and no one appearing either for or against said proposed ordinance, upon motion made, seconded and duly passed, the following ordinance is hereby adopted:

ORDINANCE REQUIRING SPECIAL STAMPS TO
HUNT BEAR, AND DEER, EXCEPTIONS:

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Russell, Virginia:

Pursuant to the authority granted by Section L3.1, Virginia Game Inland Fish and Boat Laws, it shall be unlawful for any person to hunt bear and deer in the County of Russell, without first having obtained a special stamp, the fee for which shall be one dollar (\$1.00) annually for residents of the Commonwealth of Virginia, and five dollars (\$5.00) annually for non-residents of the Commonwealth of Virginia, except that such special stamp shall not be required of resident persons 65 years of age or over to hunt bear and deer on private or state property in said County.

Any person violating the provision of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction punished accordingly.
